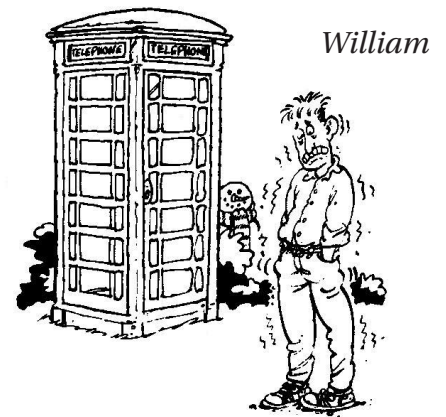
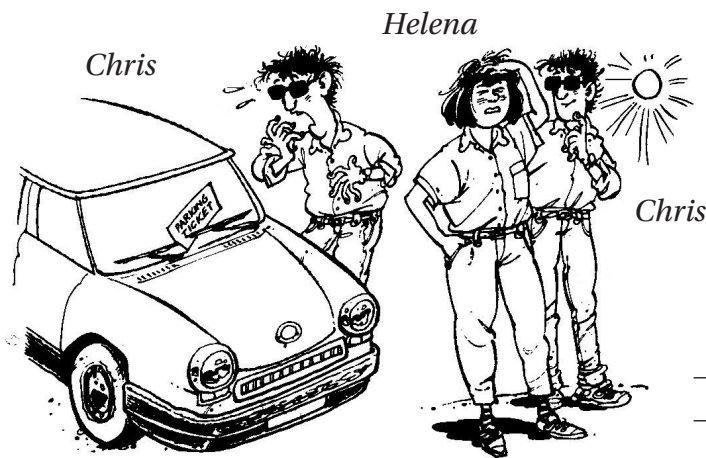


Borrowing and giving back
